The main text, like the author's names, uses Times New Roman font, 12 points. Type or paste your text into this file but remember to keep the page margins as set here, which is 2.5 cm. Paragraphs are justified paragraphs (straight edged) on both left and right.

Use single-line spacing and leave a line gap between paragraphs. This helps your text to be read easily.

The due date for abstract submissions is **Wednesday, 23 October 2024**.

The word limit for abstracts is 300 words, including any subheadings but excluding the title. The scientific committee reserves the right to edit abstracts for clarity or correctness of English but will consult the author if any significant changes are needed.

Abstract Structure

The main Headings of the abstract may include:

Background and aims: Include one or two sentences to introduce the broad topic area and provide a reason for the study then a clear statement of the study aims. A hypothesis could be included in this section. Furthermore, describe status and focuses of the clinical research study

Methods: Provide information on clinical research study type, participants, and methods. Data may include the number of participants, demographic information such as age and gender, the method of recruitment (i.e., a random sample or a convenient sample), and relevant inclusion/exclusion criteria. Measures and procedures used in the study are described in this section, along with descriptions of analyses.

Results: Provide a description of the main study findings, in addition to direct study outputs.

Conclusions: In this section you should provide statements of interpretation and implication of findings. It should not be a simple re-statement of the results. Describe the key outcomes & conclusions of the project in terms of impact for clients, health services or communities. Also outline future progression or proposed dissemination of findings.

When using abbreviations spell out the name in full at the first mention and follow with the abbreviation in parenthesis. Abbreviations may be used in the title, provided the name in full is outlined in the body of the abstract.
